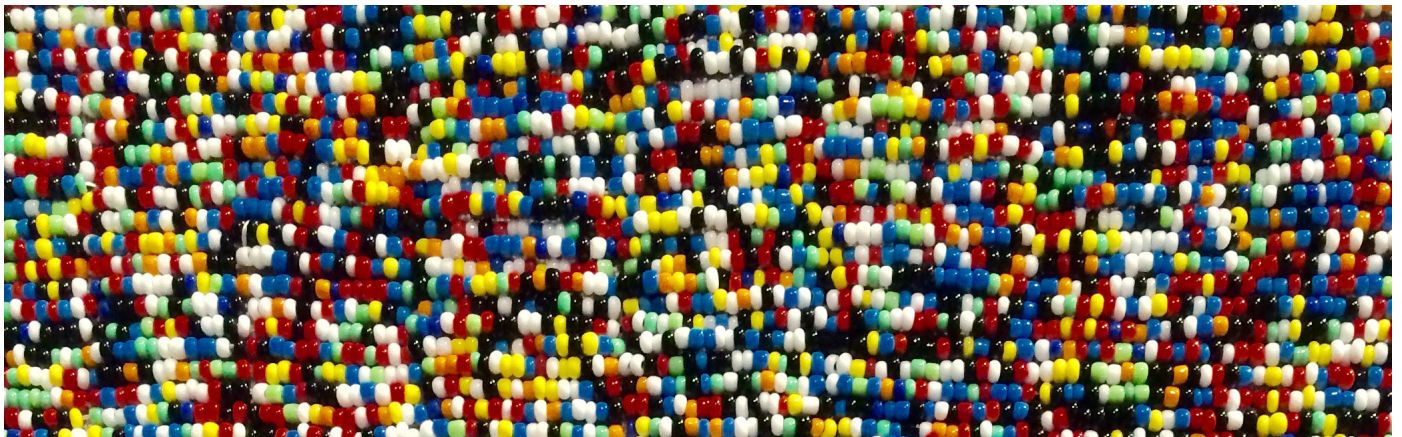

The artists in the exhibition not only produce great work but also affect the culture by curating and organizing exhibitions and events, founding galleries and cooperatives, writing books, blogs and reviews, teaching, administrating, collecting, etc. By taking control of the culture process both vertically and horizontally, artists lead rather than being subservient to a money/power system that promotes a few artists to super-star status while marginalizing all others.

At many times in history artists have taken this kind of initiative in an effort to reclaim agency and return cultural leadership to artists themselves. At a time when money and power interests dictate significance and quality for their own profit artists must assume leadership of their field.
